RI President Holger Knaack's theme for Rotary Year 2020-2021 is based on his introduction, "Every great challenge is an opportunity for renewal and growth.'



Vyrne and Alma Ruth Shofner celebrated their 70th wedding anniversary this week. They married Jan. 27, 1951, when Harry S. Truman was in the White House and the American Flag had only 48 stars.

High school sweethearts Vyrne and Alma Ruth Shofner passed their golden anniversary decades ago. This year they went platinum.

"Our marriage was built on love and giving and love through whatever hap-

pened in life and being faithful to our mate," Alma, 89, added.

The U.S. Census Bureau no longer keeps track of marriage longevity, but the last available data - from a 2009 study - indicates that only 6.2% of couples celebrated at least 50 years together.

The records did not include 70th anniversaries, which are even more rare.

"We married just before his last year of dental school and just after we came back to Nacogdoches," Alma said. "He built an office and was in practice just a short time when Uncle Sam called him.'

Vyrne, now 92, spent two years stationed in Alaska as a dentist in the U.S. Air Force during the Korean War.

After the war, they moved back to Nacogdoches where Vyrne ran Shofner Dentistry until his retirement in 1993.

The couple credits their longevity to their deep-rooted Christian

"The secret, I guess, was given many years ago. Husbands love your wives as Christ loved the church, and wives obey your husband as you obey the Lord," Vyrne said.

What church to attend though, might be the only thing the couple has never agreed about. Vyrne is a member of the Church of Christ and Alma belongs to Grace Bible Church.

"I was the organist through the years," she said. "I've retired." Even so, that's never posed any difficulties, they said.

"We have fellowship with the Lord in our own private lives together," Alma said. "It is our goal to put the Lord above all things." The Shofners have two sons, David and Mark, five grandchildren and 11 great-grandchildren. In retirement they've enjoyed traveling, especially to New England and their family ranch in West

"We've traveled guite a bit to various places," Vyrne said. "We've been all over the United States RVing."
