Program Today CASA Tonya Harry, Executive Director Introduction by Ron Collins

Born and raised in East Texas, Tonya moved to Nacogdoches in 1990 to attend SFASU. She graduated with a Bachelor of Science in Sociology, as well as met and married her husband of 28 years, Coy.

Tonya's first job out of college was with the Nacogdoches Housing Authority assisting low income families with housing needs. She spent time managing a low income public housing complex where the exposure to at-risk youth drew her to working with Child Protective Services. She spent 5 years doing field work in child abuse investigations, 8.5 years supervising the Investigations unit for Nacogdoches and Shelby Counties, and over 2 years as Program Director of Investigations for the Northern end of Region 5 covering 8 counties.

During her time at CPS, Tonya chaired the local Community Resource and Coalition Group for many years, and served as the agency representative on the boards for Child Advocacy Centers in all counties in her jurisdiction.

In 2015, Tonya accepted the position of Executive Director of CASA of Deep East Texas to allow her to continue advocacy for victims of child abuse and neglect, and to be closer to home. CASA of Deep East Texas serves Nacogdoches, Shelby, and San Augustine Counties which were already familiar territories. She is a member of the Nacogdoches Rotary Club and her favorite service project to date is reading with children at the local elementary schools. She recently joined the board of Pineywoods Blue Star Mothers which is made up of mothers with children in the armed forces

Tonya and Coy have 2 children, Connor and Cate. Connor is in the US Army, and Cate is a freshman at Douglass High School.

Her hobbies include family time, even if game night is 4 of the most competitive people in the world and will end in good natured arguments about who won. She also enjoys time at the gym, coffee without anyone speaking, road trips with her children, naps with her Great Dane at her feet, and music.

Tonya considers her life to be full of blessings and is grateful to have a career that allows her to serve some of our community's most vulnerable citizens.

CASA

When a child enters the foster care system because his or her home is no longer safe, a judge may appoint a committed volunteer to help them. That volunteer is called a Court Appointed Special Advocate®, or CASA.

CASA volunteers are screened and highly trained and then appointed by judges to represent and advocate for a child's best interests in the child protection system. CASA volunteers are each assigned to help one child or set of siblings at a time, so they can focus on giving that child or sibling group the individualized advocacy and attention they need. CASA volunteers save taxpayers money and children's futures by helping children find a safe. permanent homes as soon as possible.

CASA continues to provide valuable volunteer advocacy for every abused child in this area. CASA volunteers serve as the "eyes and ears" for the judge in child welfare cases. This includes researching each child's situation and making objective recommendations to help them reclaim their childhoods from abuse and neglect. CASA volunteers are frequently the only stable presence in these children's lives as they navigate the foster care system.

These volunteers bring three critical qualities to their work: they focus on one case at a time; they bring a unique perspective to the court case; and their sole objective is representing the best interests of the child.
